About the course

Violence affects health in multiple ways, from the interpersonal to the societal. Medical peace work is an emerging field of global health which helps health professionals identify the health effects of violence and work towards prevention and peace-building. This course introduces key concepts, opportunities and dilemmas for global health practitioners.

Three case studies are used to help you apply concepts of peace and violence to global health topics of increasing importance. Workload: 3 hours per week (9 hours total).

By the end of the course you will be able to:

- Apply security priorities, medical ethics and humanitarian law to violent conflict
- Describe the health effects of a nuclear weapon detonation and why health professional involvement in preventing nuclear conflict is important
- Explain the health effects of climate change
