Objectives and content	<p>Salutogenesis is a resource-based theoretical approach that departs from the dominant risk factor paradigm. Salutogenesis has most often been applied in health research. During the course, salutogenesis will be applied to social issues beyond health, namely in the fields of development, migration and gender.</p> <p>The <b>Objectives</b> of the course are that students should</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• actively engage with the concepts, principles and the most up-to-date literature on salutogenesis</li> <li>• apply the concepts and principles of salutogenesis in the fields of development, migration and gender</li> </ul>
